## Volunteer Opportunities

### • **Small Claims Clinic**

*Third Tuesday at the City & County Building, 11 a.m.–1 p.m.*

This is a monthly class for members of the community who seek advice on how to bring a small claim to court, including how to file and present evidence. A court clerk is typically available to sit in on this class. An outline and a video are available for your knowledge.

### • **Collections Clinic**

*Third Thursday at the City & County Building, 11 a.m.–1 p.m.*

This is a monthly class for members of the community who seek advice on how to collect on a judgment from small claims court. A court clerk is typically available to sit in on this class. An outline is available for your knowledge.

### • **Family Law/Doing Your Own Divorce Clinic**

*Third Wednesday at the City and County Building, Noon–1:30 p.m.*

*Third Tuesday at the 1200 Federal Blvd, 5:30–7 p.m.*

This is a monthly class for members of the community who seek advice on various family law topics, including obtaining a divorce and how to represent themselves in court. An outline is available for your knowledge.

### • **Bankruptcy Clinic**

*Second Tuesday and fourth Wednesday at the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, 1:30–3 p.m.*

This is a bi-monthly class for members of the community who seek advice on how to file a pro se case in bankruptcy court. An outline is available for your knowledge.

### • **Legal Night at Mi Casa & Legal Night at San Juan Diego**

*Third Tuesday of the month at Mi Casa and First Wednesday at San Juan Diego.*

*Event runs 5:30–8 p.m. You are not required to stay the entire time.*

This is a walk-in event in which volunteer attorneys provide legal referral information and advice to members of the community seeking help with immigration, family law, employment, housing, bankruptcy and criminal matters.

### • **Homeless Veterans Stand Down**

*Date TBA in November at The National Guard Armory. Two hour shifts are from 8 a.m.–3 p.m.*

This is an annual event to assist homeless veterans by answering legal questions and offering legal information and referrals to other community legal resources.

### • **Lawline 9**

*Wednesdays at 9News Building on Speer. Shifts are from 3:45–5 p.m.*

Weekly call-in program at 9News in which attorneys offer legal information and referrals to other community legal resources. Topics vary weekly.

### • **Java & Juice**

*Second Tuesday of the month at Panera Bread, 4–6 p.m.*

Attorneys attend a monthly meeting with youth who are aging out of the foster care system to answer legal questions about various pre-planned topics, such as criminal law, employment, voting rights, etc.

### • **Pro Bono Week**

*Last full week in October*

An annual celebration of attorneys who provide *pro bono* assistance to the community. Activities and opportunities vary.
